# **OBJECT OF THE WEEK**

# The history of king Richard the thirde by Thomas More 1513, printed 1557

On February 7th, 1478, Thomas More was born in London. Between the ages of 12 and 14, More served as a page in the household of John Morton, Archbishop of Canterbury and Chancellor of England. Morton supported More's early career, recognising the young man's great potential, and sponsored his place at Oxford on leaving Morton's service in 1492. The two remained friends until Morton's death in 1500, and so great was More's admiration for his patron that he cast him in his best-known work Utopia.

Morton is believed to have had an impact on More's History as one of the original sources for the work. Morton and Richard had been implacable foes, Morton having been tutor to the royal children of Edward IV who had been made illegitimate by Richard after he took the throne in 1483. The animosity between the two men was enough to force Morton to go into exile until Richard's defeat at the Battle of Bosworth in 1485. This context might explain the overwhelmingly negative opinion of Richard portrayed in the work. More's description of Richard is far from sympathetic:

'Little of stature, crooked-backed, malicious, wrathful, envious, omitting not to kiss whom he thought to kill.'

This book is the first edition of More's text on Richard III, printed from unpublished manuscripts found among his papers after his execution. The work was only published by his son-in-law William Rastell in 1557, during the reign of the Catholic Mary I. It was taken on by later writers and used as a source for other histories, and was used by Shakespeare as a source for his tragedy Richard III.

It is displayed in the Stonyhurst Museum alongside the skull of John Morton, and the First Folio of Shakespeare, opened to the play for which the work had been a key source.
