Arrangements for the Supervision of EYFS Pupils throughout the school day.

In EYFS, we use the seven areas to plan the children's learning and activities. These include: Literacy, Maths, Understanding the World, Expressive Arts and Design, Communication and Language, Physical Development and finally Personal, Social and Emotional development. We begin the term with a theme (see our Planning Cycles), and then plan activities weekly using a child centred approach that are suited to the children's unique needs, as well as their interests. We plan our classrooms so that the children have access to interactive environment to play and explore and to develop skills, as well as giving them opportunities to actively learn and create and think critically.

FS1 are supervised throughout the day by FS1 staff: A.Mastrobuoni supported by S.Jenkinson

FS2 are supervised throughout the day by FS2 staff: C.Clarkson supported by M.Meredith

Foundation Stage 1 (FS1)

The Nursery class (FS1) welcomes the preschool year (3-4 year olds). Children can be considered for entry into FSP from the term they turn 3 years old; children should be able to join in with the FS1 class. FS1 is open five days a week and children can attend for a combination of morning (including lunch) and afternoon sessions or for a full day; attendance can be increased during the school year. In FS1, children have discrete phonics and maths lessons. FS1 provides a smooth, happy transition from home to school life and the older children in FS2 are encouraged to take care of the FS1 children, particularly at lunchtimes and joint sessions.

Foundation Stage 2 (FS2)

The Reception class (FS2) is for children who are four years old on September 1st and completes the Early Years Foundation Stage. Children are expected to attend full time. In FS2, children have much more structured phonics and mathematics lessons. Children in FS2 also have an option to attend activities at the end of the school day.

Additional staff includes:

- Pre-Prep teachers and TAs and Gap students during recs, lunches and some session times.
- FS games sessions taught by the Games department.
- FS swimming sessions taught by pool staff (qualified swimming teachers)
- FS French is taught by Mrs Torz.
- FS dance sessions are taught by the College dance department.
- FS2 RE is taught by Mrs Gibson.
